

Hammond Housing Market Trending Up

In 2017, 42% of houses were sold within the first 30 days and 26% within first 60 days receiving 98% and 96% of listing price respectively. 
McDermott, Jr. "I am proud to call Hammond home".

Winter Storms Cause Blood Shortages



NOW, THEREFORE, I, Thomas M. McDermott Jr., Mayor of the City of Hammond, Indiana acknowledges the theme for 2018 "50 Years of Opening Doors" and do hereby proclaim April 2018 as,

Fair Housing Month

in the City of Hammond. I encourage all citizens of our community to support and endorse Fair Housing for all and wholeheartedly recognize these rights and responsibilities through the year.
