Bishop Noll Rebuilding Football

As part of a rebuilding effort to return the football program to its rich history of success, Bishop Noll Institute has decided to play a junior varsity schedule the next two seasons, Principal Lorenza Jara Pastrick announced Monday.

Though this was a difficult decision, Pastrick said, it is a way to ensure the safety of Noll's student-athletes, as the majority of current players are freshmen. It also allows BNI to hit the restart button on a program that has struggled on the field due to a low number of participating students in recent years.

"At the conclusion of the 2017-18 school year, we were optimistic about our program's numbers for this fall," Pastrick said. "This summer, we have been monitoring those numbers daily throughout conditioning to assure ourselves we would have enough experienced players to participate safely in a varsity season."

"Unfortunately, due to low numbers of upperclassmen on the first official day of practice today, we feel we cannot fully commit to competing at the varsity level right now. It is our

hope and sincere goal to take this season and next season to rebuild our program from the bottom up in hopes to reignite our football program and bring it back to its past competitive level. We feel it would not be prudent or responsible to subject our young and inexperienced players to the rigors of varsity football at this time."

Pastrick said Bishop Noll will do its best to compile a competitive junior varsity schedule for the coming season.

"We are extremely sorry for any and all inconveniences this causes our Greater South Shore Conference schools," she said. "We value our relationships with these schools, and have always strived to be a GSSC member in good standing."

"But we simply cannot put our students' safety and well-being at risk. We look to rebuild our program through growth of our younger players' skills and confidence, and we look for our school to rally around our football team as we have done for more than 90 years."

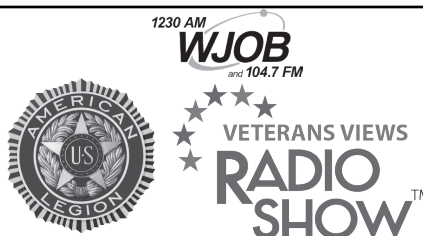

The Historic Straube Building

The years 1875-1932 were a golden age of piano making, a time when pianos had few competitors for home entertainment. The Straube Piano Company was started in 1895 by Willard N. Van Matre (a piano manufacturer) and William Straube (an investor). In 1896, Straube bought out Van Matre and incorporated in 1897. By 1901 Straube Piano Co. was recognized nationally for its fine product. In 1904, the Straube Piano Co. built a 3-story building for its manufacturing and executive offices in Hammond on five acres north of Oak Hill Cemetery. By 1911, Straube was leasing space in the "Eder Building" @ 627-629 Hohman as a show room and sales office. John F. Jarnecke, owned the large lot just south of the Eder Building occupied by three decrepit buildings. The annoyed Hohman Ave. businesses tried to sue Jarnecke in 1910 to raze the properties. Finally, in early 1913, John was convinced by his son August Jarnecke to contact an architect to design a two-story building divided into 3 rentable spaces-but it never happened. In Oct. of 1913 the elder Jarnecke had a stroke, he hastily drew up a will and died on Nov. 6, 1913. Because of the complexity of the Jarnecke will, years of probate delayed the sale of the property to financiers Carl Kaufman & Leo Wolf. It was not until April of 1916 that ground was broken for the new building with Straube

Piano & Music Co. being the main leasee. (Note-the north wall of the Straube Building was "attached" to the existing south wall of the Eder Building). Nov. of 1916 saw the first tenants move into the handsome new STRAUBE BUILDING @ 631-635 Hohman. The Straube Music Co. occupied the main building as a showroom with music teachers' rooms and concert hall on the second floor. (History note-in 1930 the north/south street addresses were reassigned as Hammond annexed Robertsdale-the Straube Building address was now 5247 Hohman). In 1931, with the coming of radio, piano sales declined and Straube sold its Hammond factory to J. L. Metz Furniture Co. By mid-1936, Straube closed down the music hall as Montgomery Ward Co. prepared to take over the entire building staying until 1964 when the Calumet Shopping Center lured them to Munster. After various tenants vacated the building in 2017, the Ham'd Redevelopment Commission purchased it. Sadly, on April 29, 2018 the once acclaimed "Straube Building" burnt down exposing the original Eder Building exterior wall and its 120-year-old advertisement for "Gold Medal Flour".

Data Center Groundbreaking

Governor Eric J. Holcomb and Hammond Mayor Thomas M. McDermott Jr. will join Thomas P. Dakich and Peter Feldman from Indiana NAP at 1:30 p.m. Central on August 15th to celebrate the groundbreaking of the Digital Crossroads of America Data Center in northwest Indiana.

Indiana NAP, a newly-launched venture advancing the high-power, high-efficiency mission critical data center project, will develop a state-of-the-art, renewable energy campus on the site of the former State Line Generating Facility, which closed in 2012. Situated just outside of Chicago along Lake Michigan, the Digital Crossroads of America Data Center will serve a growing demand for businesses and content providers to lease storage space. The project also includes plans for a 10,000-square-foot tech incubator, a greenhouse to serve Purdue University Northwest that will use waste heat from the generators,

as well as enhanced public spaces with access to the lakefront property.

The company, which chose to locate the data center in northwest Indiana over Illinois, will initially invest approximately \$40 million to construct a 105,000-square-foot facility on approximately 12 acres of the 77-acre site during the first phase to include a data center and shared-space tech incubator. The project has the potential to grow into a \$200 million investment across three buildings and 400,000 square feet of revitalized property in Hammond.

The Indiana Economic Development Corporation is supporting the project through the Industrial Recovery Tax Credit (DINO) program, which provides an incentive to invest in former industrial sites and improve quality of place in Indiana communities.

Make an appointment to donate blood by downloading the free American Red Cross Blood Donor App, visiting RedCrossBlood.org or calling 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767). Those who donated blood earlier this summer may be eligible to give again. Blood can be safely given every 56 days, and Power Red donations can be given every 16 weeks.

Simply download the American Red Cross Blood Donor App, visit RedCrossBlood.org or call 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767) to make an appointment or for more information. All blood types are needed to ensure a reliable supply for patients. A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of

identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age in most states (16 with parental consent where allowed by state law), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also have to meet certain height and weight requirements.

Blood and platelet donors can save time at their next donation by using RapidPass® to complete their pre-donation reading and health history questionnaire online, on the day of their donation, before arriving at the blood drive. To get started, follow the instructions at RedCrossBlood.org/RapidPass or use the Blood Donor App.

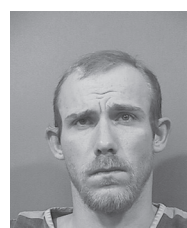

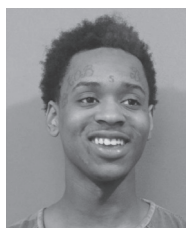
