

Hammond 12 Year Crime Stats

Mayor Thomas M. McDermott, Jr. is pleased to announce that the crime statistics for the 12-year period of 2006 through 2017 have been finalized. According to the report, Hammond's violent crime statistics (murder, rape, robbery and aggregated assault) have decreased by 19.8 percent from 2006 to the present. The violent crime of burglary had the largest drop during this period, dropping by 47.8%. Robberies also dropped dramatically across this period finishing down 27.8%

"Although any amount of crime is too much, I am encouraged that our violent crime numbers are trending in the right direction," stated Mayor McDermott. "We will continue to equip our officers with the newest technological crime fighting tools that we can afford, such as "Hammond's Blue Net" so that we can continue to battle the criminal element that tries to gain a foothold in our city."

The crime statistics are derived from the numbers that the Hammond Police Department forwards annually to the United States Department of Justice Uniform Crime Report. After investigation, reports to the federal government may be upgraded, changed, or classified as unfounded. Once a case status is modified, the numbers are changed to reflect an increase, or decrease in that particular year's crime statistics.

"I am proud of the work of Hammond's Police Chief John Doughty, Deputy Chief of Police Andy Short, and all the men and women of the Hammond Police Department. It is because of their hard work and dedication towards our safety that Hammond is a safer place to live, work and play," stated Mayor McDermott.

Hammond History Tidbits

Carroll N. Towle was born on May 1, 1846 in New Hampshire to Amos & Mary Towle, the 4th child of eleven. Around 1850 Amos Towle moved the family to the town of Haverhill, Massachusetts where he could use his skills as a shoemaker. Carroll, along with his brothers James, Charles, Amos, and Porter all worked at the Haverhill shoe factory. Their older brother Marcus, who was a butcher by trade left for the Detroit area.

When the call for men went out from President Lincoln late in 1863, Carroll only 18 years old, enlisted into Co. H, 2nd Massachusetts Heavy Artillery Regiment. His unit was engaged in many battles and he was taken captive on April 20, 1864 in Plymouth, NC. The Civil War records show him listed on the roster of Union prisoners of war at the horrible Andersonville Camp in Georgia. With the surrender of the Confederate army on April 9, 1865, the prisoners were all released and by June 12th he was on

his way home.

Carroll, now 19 years old, went back to Haverhill and continued working at the local shoe factory, where he was known to never speak of his trials in the war. Late in the 1880's Carroll, his wife Hattie, and young son Charles were living in Chicago while he worked in Hammond with the rest of the Towle dynasty built by his older brother Marcus Towle. By the 1890's Marcus was the president of the First National Bank and owned the Towle General Store, where Carroll was Vice Pres., and brother Amos was Sec./Tres. Unlike his renowned brother Marcus, Carroll Towle led a quiet life, died in June of 1898, and lays next to his wife Harriet in Historic Oak Hill Cemetery with many other members of the Towle family. But Carroll, will never be forgotten by future generations because of the Hammond street that was named after him.

Tax Talk with Neal Wallace, CPA

How does a taxpayer know if it really is the IRS calling or knocking on the door? Many taxpayers have encountered individuals impersonating IRS officials—in person, over the telephone and via email. Don't allow yourself to fall victim to a scam. It is important to understand how and when the IRS contacts taxpayers.

The IRS initiates most contacts through regular mail delivered by the United States Postal Service; however, there are special circumstances in which the IRS will call or come to a home or business. overdue tax bill, securing a delinquent tax return or a delinquent employment tax payment, or having the need to tour a business as part of an audit or during criminal investigations would all be reasons for personal visits from an IRS agent.

The IRS will not demand immediate payment using a prepaid debit card, gift card or wire transfer, nor do they demand that taxes be paid without the opportunity to question or appeal the amount owed. Taxpayers will not be threatened to bring in local police, immigration officers or other law-enforcement officials to arrest them. The IRS also cannot revoke a taxpayer's driver's license, business licenses, or immigration status. Threats like these are

common tactics scam artists use to trick victims into buying into their schemes.

Young adults and the elderly are very vulnerable so it is important to watch for unusual mail, or bank accounts with activity that may reflect a minimal withdrawal. Monitoring financial accounts and reporting any odd activity is a good practice, in addition to obtaining a yearly credit report.

Recently, the Internal Revenue Service announced that it plans to begin private collection of certain overdue federal tax debts next spring. It is important to note that the IRS will give each taxpayer and their representative written notice that their account is being transferred to a private collection agency. The agency will then send a second, separate letter to the taxpayer and their representative confirming this transfer.

Urgent Need for Blood Donors

This January, National Blood Donor Month, the American Red Cross has an urgent need for blood donors of all blood types to make an appointment to give now and help address a winter blood donation shortage.

Severe winter weather has had a tremendous impact on blood donations already this year, with more than 150 blood drives forced to cancel causing over 5,500 blood and platelet donations to go uncollected. This is in addition to seasonal illnesses, such as the flu, and hectic holiday schedules collectively contributing to more than 28,000 fewer donations than what was needed in November and December. In Indiana, the Red Cross has seen a shortfall of more than 1,400 blood donations.

"Even temporary disruptions to blood and platelet donations can diminish the availability for hospital patients," said Rodney Wilson of the Red Cross Indiana-Ohio Blood Services Region. "It's the blood on the shelves that helps save lives in an emergency, and that's why we're asking eligible individuals to make an appointment to give blood or platelets today."

While serving local hospitals is the first priority, the Red Cross can move blood products to where they're needed most. This allows generous donors throughout the country to contribute to the national blood supply

and potentially help patients locally and in storm-affected areas

While all blood types are urgently needed, there is a more critical need for the following blood and donation types right now:

•Type O negative: The blood type that can be transfused to almost everyone and is what doctors reach for in trauma situations.

•Type B negative: The blood type that can be transfused to type B Rhpositive and negative patients.

•Type AB: The plasma type that can be transfused to almost everyone and can be donated through a platelet or plasma donation, where available, or during a regular blood donation.

Eligible donors can find a blood donation opportunity and schedule an appointment to donate by using the free Blood Donor App, visiting redcrossblood.org or calling 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767). Donation appointments and completion of a RapidPass are encouraged to help speed up the donation process. RapidPass lets donors complete the pre-donation reading and answer the health history questionnaire online, on the day of their donation, by visiting redcrossblood. org/rapidpass from the convenience of a mobile device or computer, or through the Blood Donor App.
