Students Walk for Suicide Prevention

Associates of Midwest Communication Consulting, a student-led public relations firm from Purdue University Northwest, walked with thousands across the country for suicide awareness on Sept. 22.

The Out of the Darkness Walk was founded by the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention 12 years ago and has a goal to reduce the suicide rate by 20 percent by 2025. The walk was brought to Northwest Indiana when Nancy Rodgers advocated for the walk in 2007 after she lost her son to suicide.

Meridith Fionda, associate of MCC, walked for her neighbor who died from suicide in August.

Fionda walked with her neighborhood, family and colleagues. She said that touched her heart.

"It really touched my heart that we were walking together in unison about a very important issue. It is important to know that there is someone who is there for you at all times," Fionda said. "It was pretty sad and I choked up a few times, but I was happy that we were all there together."

Jordan Grinstead, associate of of MCC, walked for herself.

"Mental illness runs in

my family. I have dealt with it for years. I think it is important for people to start talking about mental illnesses," Grinstead said.

Nancy Singh, CEO of MCC, said that the most memorable part of the walk was the release of balloons to honor those who have been affected by suicide.

"It was such a beautiful and sad moment," Singh said. "To visually see how many people were affected by suicide touched my heart and made me realize how important it is to be there for each other. I am happy that we as a firm were there and joined strangers to fight against suicide."

The AFSP will accept donations for suicide prevention until Dec. 31. All donations will fund scientific research, offer educational programs for professionals, educate the public mood disorders and suicide prevention, promote policies and legislation that impact suicide and prevention, provide programs and resources for survivors of suicide at loss and for people at risk.

Purdue New Diploma Approved by Trustees

Purdue University
Northwest (PNW) students
graduating in May 2019 will
be the first graduating class to
receive a Purdue University
Northwest diploma.
Chancellor Thomas L. Keon
made the announcement to
students, faculty and staff
earlier today.

"This is an exciting step forward for Purdue Northwest," said Keon. "Everything we do as a comprehensive university to ensure the success of our graduates—from high-quality teaching and scholarship, to a robust campus community, to a growing alumni network—is now further reflected in our diploma."

Keon said as the Purdue system has evolved in recent years, with the establishment of Purdue University Northwest, Purdue University Fort Wayne, and Purdue University Global, it was increasingly valuable to distinguish between the diplomas among these various institutions more prominently. While all remain legal entities of the Trustees of Purdue University, the Board approved the diploma change for each.

Distinguishing between diplomas conferred at regional universities from a "main campus" counterpart is common among public university systems in many states, such as Wisconsin, Missouri, Nebraska, New York and California.

Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and Provost Ralph O. Mueller said offering students a Purdue University Northwest diploma is further evidence of PNW's strong academic reputation.

"Employers already look for the expertise of PNW students and graduates," said Mueller. "A clearly defined Purdue University Northwest diploma enhances the proud tradition of earning a degree from PNW's many quality, and nationally recognized, academic programs."

Support also resonates among the Purdue Northwest Alumni Community, according to Ashley Gerodimos, executive director of PNW's alumni community.

"The pride felt among current and former graduates of our institution runs deep," said Gerodimos, herself a PNW alumna. "To fully distinguish Purdue Northwest on our diplomas going forward strengthens the bonds of those of us who have had the PNW experience."

Keon said former alumni will be given the opportunity after May 2019 to order a new PNW diploma. Details will be shared through the PNW Alumni Community.

Students Plan Protest for Diploma Change

Students at Purdue University Northwest are scheduling a protest after the university announced that the diploma is changing from a Purdue University diploma to a Purdue University Northwest diploma.

Thomas Keon, chancellor of PNW, sent a university-wide email on Sept. 28 announcing that the Purdue University Board of Trustees approved the change of diploma for May 2019.

"The significance of this change for Purdue Northwest is further cementing our unique identity as a university that is strong, vibrant, innovative, diverse and increasingly a competitive choice for exceptional, nationally-recognized undergraduate and graduate education," Keon said in the email.

Kathleen Franklin, junior communication major at PNW, said that the students were promised a Purdue University diploma and that students were not consulted about the diploma change.

"I believe it should stay the same," Franklin said. "If they must change it, I believe student and faculty input is a must before they do anything permanent."

Julia Cook-Jones, senior human resource management major and communication minor, said she feels PNW is driven by profits and not by their students.

"Their mission statement, vision and purpose are all fake," Cook-Jones said. "Students have a Dean of Students so our voices can be heard, however, we are still silent."

Cook-Jones said that the university has ignored students

since Purdue University Calumet and Purdue North Central unified in 2016 and became Purdue University Northwest.

"This is more than just a name change on a degree, this is about unification," Cook-Jones said. "Unification relates to the common interests of humanity. Did the chancellor ask us how we feel? No! Did he do a petition? No! Did he tell us face to face? No! What chancellor hides behind an email instead of understanding what his students need to be academically successful?"

Franklin and Cook-Jones have arranged for a protest against the diploma change on Oct. 1 in front of the Student Union Library at the Hammond campus. They are also starting a petition on change.org titled, "Keep the Purdue Degree at PNW".

"Protests are made to hear the voices of others. We were granted with the First Amendment for a reason," Cook-Jones said. "PNW does not listen or understand the needs and wants of their students. We need to protest for a number of other issues, such as making this a parent-friendly campus."

Franklin said she is protesting because the student's voices are not being heard.

"I believe that the Chancellor and the Board of Trustees see us as dollar signs and not as people," Franklin said. "To some alumni, this is their entire life's goal, so to be ignored feels like a slap to the face."

Bishop Noll STREAM Lab

Bishop Noll Institute has announced plans to renovate its former natatorium into a stateof-the-art STREAM Lab and Innovation Center with a goal of opening for classes in Fall 2019.

The \$1 million-plus project, to be funded primarily by the school's Ignite & Inspire capital campaign, was given the go-ahead Aug. 27 at a special meeting of the Bishop Noll School Board and is the centerpiece of the school's drive to become the first elite STREAM school in Indiana. BNI President Paul Mullaney said.

"We are grateful to our principal, Lorenza Jara Pastrick, and her faculty STREAM team on their vision for this facility, which will be unlike any other in our region," Mullaney said. "The team has developed a vision for our second century that does more than prepare our young men and women for a future in STEM careers. At Bishop Noll, on top of the 21st century learning skills, we feel it is necessary to incorporate the truths of faith and beauty in the world God has given us."

STREAM is Noll's version of STEM, which stands for science, technology, engineering and math. Pastrick said expanding the curriculum at Bishop Noll to incorporate religion (R) and the arts (A) fully integrates two of the school's curricular hallmarks.

Bishop Noll, which opened as Catholic Central High School in 1921 and is now in its 98th school year, follows the nationally respected STEM curriculum of Project Lead the Way, then adding religion and arts components. All freshmen take BNI's introductory STREAM course, after which various electives are offered in areas of engineering, computer programming and, coming soon, biomedical courses. These are offered at Noll in addition to more traditional science courses, Pastrick said.

The innovative STREAM Lab will consist of a learning studio and design lab, with flexible seating allowing students to work collaboratively; a makerspace for more hands-on work and creating prototypes based on original designs; and a prototype studio to build models and use larger equipment as students build final products for display.

"This Innovation Center will create a welcoming environment, and will enhance our curriculum and our STREAM vision at Bishop Noll," Pastrick said. "The faculty and students are excited for its possibilities, and we are grateful to our supporters of the capital campaign for making this happen."

The Ignite & Inspire campaign, to date, has raised nearly \$1.9 million of its \$3.5 million goal, Mullaney said. In addition to funding the STREAM Lab, the campaign will help renovate outdoor athletic facilities and fund an endowment to assist BNI faculty members seeking advanced degrees or training.

The STREAM renovation will fully convert the school's former pool area, which has not been used for swimming in more than 20 years.

The STREAM Lab will be the latest of many technology and building upgrades at Bishop Noll in recent years, Mullaney said. The school has strategically performed upgrades of bandwith to support the 1-to-1 iPad program now in place, and in the spring final touches were implemented in the conversion of the school's library into a 21st century, technologydriven media center.



Charges Filed in Wire Thefts
