

Hammond City Water Concern

The Hammond Water Works Department has reviewed the statement issued by the School City of Hammond reporting that certain fixtures located within certain schools preliminarily tested positive for elevated levels of lead.

In conjunction with the Indiana Department of Environmental Management, the Hammond Water Works Department routinely tests its water purification plant and the entire circulatory system in various locations throughout the City of Hammond. These tests indicate no elevated lead levels in our potable water. If lead levels are, in fact, unsafe within some of the School City's buildings, the problem stems from internal fixtures and presents no danger to

the general public or the customers of the Hammond Water Works who utilize Hammond water.

"I want to assure Hammond residents that our water is safe for drinking and all other uses," stated Mayor McDermott. "The Hammond Filtration System uses the highest standards for testing and filtration procedures necessary to ensure safe drinking water for our residents and its customers. The matters that have been brought up by the School City of Hammond have to do with fixtures and pipes that exist within their buildings and not within the City of Hammond water system."

Griffith Police Benefit from Audit

The Griffith Police Department continues to benefit from the communication audit completed by Northwest Communication Consulting in

Northwest Communication Consulting was a student-led consulting firm consisting of students from the 2016 senior-level class called Problems in Public Relations at Purdue University Northwest.

Greg Mance, Griffith chief of police, said he was impressed with the students.

"I was impressed with the level of professionalism," Mance said. "The organization was like a well-established company and met all of our deadlines."

Mance said that even after two years of the audit, he still notices changes in the police department's communication.

Jessica Someson, vice president of operations for Northwest Communication Consulting, said the firm recommended the police department to have more faceto-face communication and conduct surveys to understand the officers' wants and concerns.

"We now perform surveys," Mance said. "It seems that there's less confusion about certain things and the officers can now communicate with us on a comfortable level."

Someson said that they also recommended posting the mission statement in every office at the police station.

"This allows people to recognize who they are and understand what they are there for," Someson said.

Mance said that the mission statement has been revised and that they used the

firm's recommendation.

"We put that into place immediately," Mance said. "Before we had a vague mission statement."

At the end of the audit, the police department received a book written by the students with all the research, data and recommendations to improve the department's communication.

Mance believes that more organizations should take advantage of this student-led program.

"More people should be aware of these opportunities by colleges and universities," Mance said. "There is so much talent and training in these students."

Someson said that this class gave her the most hands-on training in the field and made her realize that she wanted to work in public relations. Someson is a Marketing Operation Coordinator for Real Food Blends in Chesterton, Ind. and has been with them since June 2017.

"It became my whole life and I decided that this was what I wanted to do," Someson said.

This year's class, Midwest Communication Consulting, is in search of an organization to serve as its client.

Help Blood Supply Match Diversity

The American Red Cross urges people of all races and ethnicities to give blood to help ensure a diverse blood supply for patients in need.

The vast majority of blood types fall into one of the major ABO groups. However, some blood types are unique to certain racial and ethnic groups, so a diverse blood supply is important to meeting the medical needs of an increasingly diverse patient population.

Twelve-year-old Braden Green required blood transfusions to treat complications from sickle cell disease. "It saved his life, that blood transfusion," said his mom, Brenda Green. "A blood donation can give a patient another chance at life or an opportunity to get through the day."

Blood given to patients with rare blood types or those who need repeated transfusions for conditions such as sickle cell disease or

thalassemia must be matched very closely. Patients are less likely to have complications from blood donated by someone with a similar racial or ethnic background.

All blood types are needed to ensure that the right blood product is available at the right time for all patients. Make an appointment to donate blood by downloading the free American Red Cross Blood Donor App, visiting RedCrossBlood.org or calling 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767).





MySchoolDance Plans School Dances

My School Dance is a free online application that manages all aspects of school dances and events. It's the perfect tool for schools to use to ensure their planning process is stress free and easy.

"My favorite feature would be a tie between the text to parents upon student arrival and departure, and the ticket download process. Being a parent, the safety of my child is most important, and knowing that they arrived where they were supposed to be would give me peace of mind. But for schools, having it where students cannot download their tickets until all forms are signed eliminates a ton of work," said Buckley.

Schools are able to create landing pages for each dance or event that can be accessible by parents, students, faculty and staff. They then can cross promote their landing page on social media channels and post updates regarding their dance or event so everyone is updated with new information.

Signing your school up is super easy too! All you do is go to www.myschooldance. com to sign your school up and a dance partner will be in contact with you to help set up your first dance.
