

Be a Lifesaver-Give Blood

Eligible blood donors of all blood types – especially type O – are urged to give blood through the American Red Cross now to help ensure a sufficient supply for hospital patients this spring.

By giving blood, donors may be helping someone like 5-year-old Emery Twehues, who was diagnosed with acute lymphocytic leukemia last spring. During her intense cancer treatments, Emery has needed both blood and platelets. Cancers, such as leukemia and lymphoma, and certain types of chemotherapy drugs and radiation can damage the bone marrow, where red blood cells and platelets are produced.

"Emery would not be able to recover from chemotherapy without lifesaving transfusions," said her mom, Morgan Twehues. "Every time they hang a bag of platelets or blood up on her IV pole, I wish whoever donated that could see who it's going to. There would be no chance for her to live, taking that chemotherapy, if it weren't for the blood products."

In order to meet the needs of patients like Emery, the Red Cross must collect about 13,000 blood and more than 2,500 platelet donations every day. In Indiana alone the Red Cross needs more than 450 donors each day to support patients at 80 hospitals across the state.

She won a Whiting Writers' Award and a National Book Foundation "5 Under 35" award; she was a finalist for the Eugene & Marilyn Glick Indiana Emerging Author Award, and on the longlist for the PEN Open Book Award. She is the recipient of a Fulbright Fellowship, a Fellowship from the Institució de les Lletres Catalanes in Barcelona, and residency fellowships from the MacDowell Colony and Ledig House.

Van Der Vliet Oloomi's work has been compared to that of Vladimir Nabokov, Alfred Hitchcock, and Rachel Kushner. Her work has appeared in Electric Literature, The Paris Review, GRANTA, Guernica, BOMB, and the Los Angeles Review of Books Quarterly Journal, among other places. Call Me Zebra is forthcoming in Romania and Turkey. She is an Assistant Professor in the English Department's M.F.A. Program in Creative Writing at the University of Notre Dame, splitting her time between South Bend, Indiana, and Florence, Italy.

Mother Builds Support for Down Syndrome

Being a parent is scary. Being a parent to a child with a disability can be even scarier.

Dawn Buckley, the executive director of the Down Syndrome Association of Northwest Indiana and Chicagoland, felt lost and alone, ten years ago when she first learned her firstborn daughter, Addi was diagnosed with Down syndrome.

"There was minimal support at the hospital. There was a geneticist that came in and explained what Down syndrome was in technical terms but that was it," said Buckley.

Being a teacher, 12 years prior to having her daughter, Buckley worked with many children with several different types of disabilities but she had never worked with anyone with Down syndrome.

Buckley began to do some research to better understand the disability and soon discovered the DSA. It was there she started to move forward. Later, she met the Longo family through her doctor. They were the first people to give her hope regarding her daughter's future.

It was the Longo's daughter Olivia, who also has down syndrome, simply being her sweet self that

made Buckley realize her daughter could, in fact, have a great quality of life.

"After I met Olivia everything changed because I understood the diagnosis," stated Buckley.

Becoming a part of the DSA made Buckley realize how much could be done to help families just like hers.

With her teaching experience and her drive as a caring mother, she started the Art Abound program out of her basement to help bring art into the lives of those with all different types of disabilities. She then moved onto tutoring and soon built with the help of over 68 local businesses and labor unions, an office space to hold the multitude of events and programs to help local families that have a loved one with a disability.

Buckley and the DSA want to use the three pillars of education, inclusion and support to encourage citizens to make the community a better place and help families just like Buckley's feel supported right from the start.

Educator Helping Girls Gain Confidence

Finding something to do that you are passionate about can be difficult, but one teacher has found something that combines two of her passions.

Special education teacher Lisa Rudy is using her passion for working with kids and running to help girls gain confidence for the past six years.

Rudy has not always liked running. When she was a child she hated to run and it was not until she was an adult that she started to enjoy it. Rudy explained that since she started running, she has been able to focus her mind better and able to go through life a bit more relaxed.

In 2013, a parent came to Rudy and asked if she would help start a Girls on the Run program at the school. Rudy found her love for running and with the support of the GOTR of Northwest Indiana council started the program at James B. Eads Elementary School.

GOTR is a non-profit organization for girls in third through eighth grade. It is a 10-week program which meets two times a week. The meetings focus on running as well as social and emotional learning.

"The team is the girls' team, and I want to make sure everyone feels a part of it. We want everyone to feel welcome no matter their

background," said Rudy.

Rudy has been a coach for 11 seasons now and says each season is a whole new experience.

"I learn so much about myself each season," stated Rudy.

Rudy even has a favorite lesson from the program which is STAR balance. Each point of the star stands for something in a person life. Running is just part of the program that is a tool to confidence.

The most important thing to Rudy is for the girls in the program to have fun, because when they have fun, the lessons have more impact.

Rudy loves seeing how much the girls grow in both their running and their confidence. At the end of the season, the girls all run the GOTR 5K and celebrate their hard work. Rudy and her team make hair ties with different ribbons that show all of their accomplishments throughout the season.

The program's mission is to inspire girls to be joyful, healthy and confident by using a fun, experience-based curriculum which creatively integrates running.

Charges Filed Against Office Vasquez

On March 26th, criminal felony charges were filed against Lake County Police Officer Louis Vasquez following an investigation by the Indiana State Police that was requested by Sheriff Oscar Martinez. Officer Vasquez, who was placed on administrative leave by Sheriff Martinez pending the results of the investigation, has been charged with four felonies allegedly related to the theft of money he was paid for conducting Salvage Vehicle Inspections.

Prior to the filing of these criminal charges, Sheriff Martinez was notified by the Indiana State Police on January 17, 2019, that their investigation revealed Officer Vasquez had allegedly engaged in a series of illicit transactions, from September of 2017 through November of 2018, where he had performed numerous false or fraudulent Salvage Vehicle Identification Number ("VIN") inspections for his own personal financial gain. Following this report, On January 19, 2019, Sheriff Martinez filed formal disciplinary charges against

Officer Vasquez, with the Lake County Sheriff's Merit Board seeking his termination as a county police officer. The disciplinary charges pending before the Merit Board are expected to be scheduled for a final hearing sometime this summer.

Concerning the recently filed criminal charges, Sheriff Martinez stated:

"I'm very proud of the hard work and dedication of our county officers and the effort they put in, 24 hours a day, to protect our citizens, taxpayers and children from the criminals prey on members of our community."

"I fully support the work being done every day by our county police officers and the members of our local law enforcement community - but – if an officer crosses the line, fails to abide by the law and their oath to protect and serve, they must be held accountable - as nobody, including police officers, are above the law."


