



Rockopelli Gives to Local Organizations

Since 2012, Rockopelli Music Fest has donated almost \$80,000 from its annual music festival back to charities in the area.

Murph's Gift of Music, Planting Possibilities and Emma's Footprints are some of the local non-profit organizations that have benefitted from Rockopelli's donations.

Rockopelli founder, Joel Ratajack said, "We spend a lot of time vetting the organizations we support and try to focus on what is most needed in our community."

Murph's Gift of Music mission is to provide music related lessons and instruments to children from families that do not have the financial means to provide this opportunity.

As a result of Rockopelli's 2018 donation, Murph's Gift of Music was able to provide seven students with music scholarships to further their education.

Planting Possibilities provides employment, job skills training and volunteer opportunities for adults with developmental and intellectual disabilities in Northwest Indiana.

Later this year Planting Possibilities plans to purchase land to build their first

greenhouse, a long-time goal of the organization. Rockopelli's donation will go towards the purchase of land.

"We look at supporting organizations such as Planting Possibilities and Murph's Gift of Music as an investment in our community's future. They're truly striving to serve much needed causes, said Ratajack.

Emma's Footprints is dedicated to supporting families that have babies in the neonatal intensive care unit and families who have experienced the loss of a baby from pregnancy through infancy.

Since last year's donation, Rockopelli was able to help fund Emma's Footprints Mother's Day Brunch, a free event for mothers involved in the organization.

Rockopelli Music Fest is a non-profit organization that produces and promotes music festivals for local charities.



Region Riot Criterium Returns to Hammond

Mayor Thomas M. McDermott, Jr., in partnership with Region Racing Powered by Strack & Van Til is proud to bring back the Region Riot Criterium bike race to the city of Hammond on Saturday, May 11, 2019 from 8:00 am until 6:00 pm.

A criterium cycling race, also known as a crit, is a bike race consisting of multiple laps around a closed circuit, the length of each lap or circuit ranging from 800 meters to 5 km. The Riot course is 2 km (1.3 miles). Events often have prizes called primes (pronounced /pri:mz/) for winning specific intermediate laps. An announcer broadcast tells the riders that whoever wins the next lap, wins the prime. Spectators are welcome to watch the cyclists compete at designated spots along the course. Since these races are known to be extremely competitive, sometimes there is bumping and crashes in the pack.

The Hammond Region Riot Criterium details are below: Location – Wolf Lake Memorial Park, 2324 Calumet Avenue, Hammond, Indiana, and the race will circle around the Calumet Avenue,

129th Street and Sheffield Parkway. Parking is available at the splash pad and near the Pavilion.

Students Fight Pediatric Cancer

Music and laughter filled the Fitness and Recreation Center at Purdue University Northwest as student athletes played their favorite sports to raise money for pediatric cancer research.

Donations were collected for Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation, which funds pediatric cancer research. The foundation began in 2005 after the death of Alexandra "Alex" Scott who held a lemonade stand in her front yard to raise money for pediatric cancer research at the age of 4. She was diagnosed with neuroblastoma and died from the disease in 2004.

Rick Costello, athletic director at PNW, watched with a proud smile on his face as the athletes played volleyball, basketball and soccer with the determination to win the battle against pediatric cancer.

Costello and his daughter attended the Annual 'Elemonate' Cancer 5k Race hosted last year by Northwestern Mutual. Costello wanted to bring the event to PNW after experiencing the event last year and co-host it with Northwestern Mutual.

"I was so touched by Alex's story," Costello said. "I thought it would be an amazing idea to bring it here for the athletes to take part in."

Costello said that his family had personal experiences with cancer, and he does not want to see it affect any more people.

"We are passionate about contributing to the fight," Costello said.

Auburn Dodd, junior volleyball player, said the event was one of the most memorable moments of her life. Dodd said that Costello held a meeting with the student athletes and told them about the foundation and Alex's story.

"When Rick showed us the video, I knew I needed to do something," Dodd said. "I have family members who were affected by cancer and it hurt so much to see them in pain. I cannot imagine what it would be like to watch your kid go through it."

The event was co-hosted by both PNW Athletics and Northwestern mutual. Many student athletes attended the event along with their coaches and families.

"We all came together in hope of creating a better world without cancer," said Dodd.

Serene Jones, junior volleyball player, explained that it is important for people to be aware of pediatric cancer and understand what can be done to help eliminate it.

"Alex's Lemonade stand is working towards such an inspiring goal," Jones said. "They are working towards the goal of eliminating pediatric cancer and that is so inspiring. I want everyone to be able to hear Alex's story and hear about how big pediatric cancer is."

As the student athletes won many games in volleyball, soccer and basketball, they hoped that they could win the ultimate fight against pediatric cancer.

"There has to be a cure out there," Dodd said. "We have to find that cure and stop innocent children from dying. That is why we were out there raising money. We were doing it for them. Kids look up to athletes and we are always here to support them. We're in this fight together."

Local Teacher Changes Way Stem is Viewed

Tracy Mezera-Juarez, a teacher at Highland High School, is using drones to redefine how

Science, Technology, Engineering and Math learning is approached in the classroom.

“I identified the need for STEM with my students because in a fast-paced society, it’s difficult to hold their attention,” said Mezera-Juarez. “By integrating technology with STEM subjects, I am able to strengthen my students’ abilities to be creative problem solvers and think spatially.”

The Parrot drones give students in the tech class a tactile way of seeing their coding come to life. Mezera-Juarez sets up obstacle courses both indoors and outdoors that allows student’s map out and measure spatial recognition by incorporating physics.

The drones look to empower students to be creators with technology and not just consumers.

“Using their imagination students can map out a pathway in their minds, test it, receive feedback from their peers, revise and then reach the destination they were meant to,” said Mezera-Juarez. “It’s amazing to watch how much they learn while having a great time learning.”

Highland Education

Foundation looks for innovative teachers who go beyond the basics and want to develop a new way to teach a particular concept.

“There is such an emphasis placed on STEM education but creativity is usually left out,” explained Judi Caddick, president of HEF. “The fact that she found a way to combine technology in a creative and exciting manner is what really stood out in our decision-making process.”

Mezera-Juarez was one of the several grant recipients from HEF’s first cycle this year of providing grants to enhance the learning environment since Caddick started the organization in 2015.

“I love that they encourage and support my creativity,” said Mezera-Juarez. “The grants they fund provide such amazing opportunities for Highland students.”

The Highland Education Foundation is a nonprofit organization committed to funding educational grants to teachers in the School Town of Highland in order to provide opportunities that enhance student learning and achievement.






