



All community members are invited to attend. The event begins at 5:00pm to 7:00pm at Schoop's Hamburger Restaurant 7235 Indianapolis Blvd. Please contact Sgt. Scott Holbrook with questions: (219)852-6376.

Coffee with a Cop provides a unique opportunity for community members to ask questions and learn more about the department's work in Hammond's neighborhoods.

The majority of contacts law enforcement has with the public happen during emergencies, or emotional situations. Those situations are not always the most effective times for relationship building with the community, and some community members may feel that officers are unapproachable on the street. Coffee with a Cop breaks

down barriers and allows for a relaxed, one-on-one interaction.

"We hope that community members will feel comfortable to ask questions, bring concerns, or simply get to know our officers," said Captain Alcox Hammond Police Department. "These interactions are the foundation of community partnerships."

Coffee with a Cop is a national initiative supported by The United States Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services. Similar events are being held across the county, as local police departments strive to make lasting connections with the communities they serve.

The program aims to advance the practice of community policing through improving relationships between police officers and community members one cup of coffee at a time.

The Hammond Police Academy Bound

The Hammond Police Department proudly displayed their new community engagement wall during the swearing-in of six new "Academy Bound" graduates and recognition awards ceremony.

The new officers are part of an increasingly popular program created by Hammond Police Chief John Doughty. It's the brainchild created when Mayor Thomas McDermott Jr.'s award-winning "College Bound" program met the vision of a progressive Chief. "It was the next logical next step for us," said Chief Doughty. "College Bound sends interested Hammond kids to college and I thought, why can't we create a program to send young Hammond residents that are interested in law enforcement, to the police academy?"

Academy Bound was born and now Hammond residents between the ages of 21-28 can apply for the program, and if they meet the requirements and get selected, will be sent to the police academy free of charge. If they successfully graduate, the cadets are offered a job as a new police officer. We feel that hiring officers who were born and raised in Hammond will add so much back to the communities they will serve.

Hammond swore in the six latest graduates of the program on Thursday. They are Tyler Crussen, Jesse Escamilla, Taylor Hensley, Xavier Reillo, Daniel Villagomez, and Raymond Velez.

Another event that took place today was the inaugural recognition awards ceremony. New award plaques note recent accomplishments by the officers such as heroic acts, distinguished services, or life-saving events. These plaques are displayed next to a framed photograph showing every officer on the department. We hope that this too will help families, friends, and the community better engage with the officers.

The new back drop display reflects the everyday mission and vision of the men and women of the Hammond Police Department. The words were chosen because they represent what a police officer needs to possess to be an outstanding officer. And that's exactly what this department has. 211 of them to be exact.

Local Islamic Center Celebrates 21 Years

The Illiana Islamic Association has completed 21 years of service since launching in 1998. During these years, the organization has enhanced and expanded as a known center within Northwest Indiana that services the Muslim community.

Muhammed Mazen Kudaimi is president of Illiana Islamic Association, board certified physician in Internal Medicine and Gastroenterology, chairman of CAIR-Chicago Organization, and he currently practices gastroenterology in multiple hospital in the area.

Kudaimi has joined the Illiana Islamic association in 1994 as a board member when it was a two-floor rented building as an Arabic school. "The members of the organization paid \$500 for every Sunday to teach their students Islam and Arabic language," Kudaimi said. "In 1998, members and funders helped the organization to buy the \$4 million building located in Highland."

The organization was well-served by volunteers in the surrounding society and Muslim's community to reach this point. Now the mosque is

serving more than 500 Muslims to practice their prayers. Noon school teaches the Arabic language and is open for everyone. Also, religious and Quran studies, a gym, marriage and funeral services were offered.

Ralph Potesta, a police officer, has enjoyed his time in the organization during his shift. "I didn't know this organization before I was assigned here. However, now I am happy to spend my time here, and the people are open-minded, friendly and treated me with generosity," Poteste said.

"Over 11 years, we haven't faced any difficulties, instead we were welcomed by the American society here," Kudaimi said, "Muslims are new here, so misunderstandings might appear, and that happened with Catholics and Jewish people before, but over time all barricade vanished with hard work."



NWI Camp Has Lasting Impact

For Emma Paulson, science and math have always been her strongest subjects in school. From problem-solving to gathering an impressive collection of rocks and crystals, she knew she had found her passion.

So when she found out that she would be attending a program at Dunes Learning Center, she was ecstatic.

"I was so excited when I found out about the trip," Paulson said. "When I saw that we would be learning about the history of ecology of the dunes, it made me even more happy!"

Paulson, along with her fellow fourth-grade classmates, was set to attend a three-day, two-night program at the camp. The program, entitled Frog in the Bog, would take the students out of classroom and into the national park.

Much like Paulson's group, classes in grades four through six who participate in Frog in the Bog have a similar experience. Students are taken on a series of guided hikes through the national park and learn about diverse ecosystems and history through guided tours of the surrounding area.

"During one of our hikes we got to go off and sit on our own for a few minutes," said Paulson. "It was so quiet and I could really take my time and look at every leaf, plant and rock. That is one of my favorite memories."

Paulson, now in seventh grade, attributes her love of science to the program and specifically the memory.

"Whenever I'm in science class, I like to make connection to what we're talking about to what I learned during the

program," Paulson said. "I'm really interested in science now, and I think it's because I had a positive experience at the camp."

Paulson's mother, Karen Paulson, praised Dunes Learning Center for their work.

"Both my daughters attended the same program at the camp," Paulson said. "It's amazing how much of an impact they have on students' lives. You could tell how much the program influenced Emma. It was all she talked about for weeks."

Other students who have participated in programs at Dunes Learning Center have similar experiences to Paulson.

"A lot of our students end up coming back," Marketing and Development Director Heather Hahn Sullivan said. "Some of our current naturalist interns were campers here when they were younger! It's great getting to see the impact we make on their lives."

Frog in the Bog is one of Dunes Learning Center's most popular school-year programs. In April, the camp received funding to adapt one of the programs, entitled A Walk Through Time, into a day-long program, giving more students the unique learning opportunity Paulson experienced.

Dunes Learning Center is the nonprofit education partner of the Indiana Dunes National Park. They offer environmental education programs that inspire lasting curiosity and stewardship with nature. "I used to run but I broke my ankle and it required surgery," Noe said. "I ride about two to three times a week. I have such a healthier lifestyle now and a great community of cycling friends. I've seen parts of Northwest Indiana while biking that I never would have seen otherwise."

Noe's perseverance while riding with the Joyriders gave her the ability to reach tremendous goals after her injury.

"I've proven it to myself that I can do it, I rode 50 miles at a time. Nine years ago, I was afraid to get back on my bike, it's never too late," Noe said.

Noe describes Joyriders to be a welcoming group of friends with a philanthropist heart.

"It doesn't matter your level of ability, they leave no one behind," Noe said. "They teach [new riders] how to ride better and safely. They bring the joy of riding to more people in the community."

Joyriders carry their "no one gets left behind" culture to the Spinning Spokes Feeding Folks event each year, helping riders along the trails and managing SAG stops.

"A lot of Joyriders ride and serve as mentors," Noe said. "They assist in making sure everyone stays safe and has a good time."

Noe's goal for this year's upcoming Spinning Spokes Feeding Folks event is to welcome 100 riders along for the ride, no matter what their level of ability is.

"I just love to see people come out and support Meals on Wheels and the work we do," Noe said. "It's not just about money, it's letting people know we're here. We're getting bike riders together and making friends while contributing to a great cause at the same time."

Cultural Jet Lag Exhibit Opens

Cultural Jet Lag, an exhibit featuring the works of artists Jim Siergey and John Anthony Giemzik III, two players in the underground art scene for over two decades, opens at Paul Henry's Art Gallery in Hammond on May 18 & 19. Siergey's art has been described as an illogical combination of high and low culture with no regard for time and space while Giemzik's self-taught, urban-organic style creates complex, whimsical and thought-provoking work. Two public opening receptions are planned for the May 18/19 weekend: Saturday from 1-8 p.m. and Sunday from 2-6 p.m. The exhibit continues through June 30.

Jim Siergey was already active in the underground and alternative comix world when he met Tom Roberts in the 1980s where they found they had a penchant for meshing what was considered high culture with low culture and Cultural Jet Lag was born.

The first Cultural Jet Lag comic strip appeared in New City, a Chicago weekly newspaper, in 1990. CJL went on to appear in over 150 alternative publications across the country. A separate CJL was created for Time Magazine, where it ran as a regular feature for 4 ½ years. Another composition of CJL appeared in the Sunday magazine supplement of USA Weekend. Two comic book compilations also followed.

New City's Aaron Cohen wrote "Cultural Jet Lag goes beyond strictly comic art, stretching into the realms of philosophy and politics to force highbrows and lowbrows to swim in the same pool."

Tom Roberts had muscular dystrophy and passed away in 1999 at the age of 39. Siergey continued the strip for another decade or so before retiring it.

Growing up, John Anthony Giemzik III was fueled by his fascination with 1970s underground comic books and would doodle on everything: textbook margins, the backside of envelopes and bathroom stalls were all fair game. Twenty five years later, his once meaningless doodles have maintained a timeless appeal with a delightfully bizarre approach. Pure imagination is always relevant...as Giemzik assigns a crammed, clamoring grab of faces to the human condition within the crowd surrounding us.






