

Missing Blood Types

The meric n Red Cr ss needs _l_ _d d_n_rs to bring back the missing A's, B's and O's. A few missing letters may not seem like a big deal in a sentence, but for patients who need A, B, O and AB blood types, these missing letters mean life. The Red Cross urges donors of all blood types to give now to help prevent delays in medical care this summer.

Six years ago, doctors told Jacqueline Rogers' family that there wasn't enough type O negative blood available to perform her open-heart surgery. This news that her surgery was postponed was scary for Jacqueline, just 8 at the time, who was born with a congenital heart disorder. "No blood means no surgery. I thought I was going to die." Fortunately, blood donors stepped up, and Jacqueline's surgery was successfully completed a week later.

To draw attention that blood types sometimes do go missing from hospital shelves, A's, B's and O's began disappearing on June 11 from iconic brand logos, social media pages, signs and websites as part of the Missing Types campaign. The campaign is raising awareness of the need for more blood donors.

While thousands of blood donors have answered the call to fill the Missing Types, more donors are needed now to help ensure patients don't have to wait for blood products. During the summer, especially around holidays like Independence Day, donations often don't keep pace with patient needs. The Red Cross is thanking all those who come to donate July 1-6 with an exclusive Red Cross Missing Types T-shirt, while supplies last.

Purdue's Sinai Forum Tickets

Five prominent leaders are coming to the Purdue University Northwest (PNW) Sinai Forum during the acclaimed speaker series' 66th season this fall, starting September 8 with former White House Chief of Staff General John F. Kelly, U.S. Marine Corps (RET).

"This year's series features leaders in their respective fields. From those in government and law to those who inspire movements and change," said Sinai Forum Executive Director Leslie Plesac. "We are grateful for the generosity of our sponsors to help us bring a wonderfully diverse and dynamic lineup of speakers to northwest Indiana."

Tickets for the general public went on sale starting Monday, June 10 at www. pnw.edu/sinai-forum.

Hosting prominent speakers has been the cornerstone of the Sinai Forum's renowned history. Plesac said the Forum is designed to give audiences a unique opportunity to hear noted speakers and pose questions in a town-hall style format.

The season runs from September through December, leading off with Gen. Kelly at the Stardust Event Center at Blue Chip Casino, Hotel & Spa in Michigan City, Indiana. The remaining programs are hosted at the James B. Dworkin Student Services and Activities Complex on PNW's Westville Campus,

1401 S. U.S. 421, Westville. All programs will begin at 4 p.m., with doors opening at 3 p.m.

Tickets are sold as a season series for all programs. A limited number of single program tickets will be offered only for Gen. Kelly.

Regular season series tickets with general seating for all five programs are \$150 each. Patron season series tickets, including reserved seating and an exclusive reception with speakers before each program, are \$275 each. Single program tickets for Gen. Kelly are \$100 each.

Admission for all programs is free for high school and college students with a valid student ID card. Advanced student reservation is required for the Gen. Kelly program.

Purdue's CIVS Receives NEEC Grant

Purdue University Northwest's Center Innovation through Visualization and Simulation (CIVS) has been awarded a 2019 – 2020 research grant under the Naval Engineering Consortium Education (NEEC) program, through the Department of the Navy, Naval Surface Warfare Center, Crane Division (NSWC Crane). The project, "Visualization of Repair Operations Management for Networked Systems Resilience," will research and develop visualization approaches to help efficiently find solutions for optimizing repair operations and mitigating network failure, for a model-based decision support system.

The research team includes faculty both from Purdue University Northwest, who provide expertise in advanced visualization technologies and machine learning applications, and from Purdue West Lafayette, who developed a prototype software to model and analyze networked systems and potential responses to disruptions.

CIVS Director and Professor Chenn Zhou, Ph.D., Principal Investigator (PI), and PNW Associate Professor Bin Chen, Ph.D., co-PI, will lead efforts to develop a user-friendly, visualization-based system interface, while West Lafayette faculty Seokcheon Lee, Ph.D., and Shimon Nof, Ph.D., co-PIs, will lead software advancement and integration of real-world network component characteristics.

CIVS to Enhance Repair Operations Management through Visualization

Bryan Woosley, Ph.D., NSWC Crane University Liaison and NSWC Crane NEEC Coordinator, described the initiative as follows: "Through the NEEC program, we can tap into research labs and support academic connections and projects that help drive technology advancements and resolve challenges important to both Navy and civilian applications. NEEC also provides opportunities for students to gain experience and skills in research areas and technologies of interest to the Navy—and opportunities for both students and faculty to become aware of internships and civilian careers in the Naval Sea Systems Command."

Purdue University Northwest's CIVS is an interdisciplinary applied research center that combines advanced simulation techniques with 3D visualization and virtual reality/augmented reality/mixed reality technologies to produce innovative solutions in response to real-world industrial, research, and community challenges. Purdue Recognizes Graduates

Purdue University Northwest's (PNW) 2019 spring semester Dean's List recognizes 1,758 undergraduate students for their academic achievement.

Lakeshore Public Media Back Up

Lakeshore Public Media announced today it was finally able to return to full power with the installation and certification of its new digital transmitter, restoring Lakeshore PBS broadcast service to the Chicagoland market.

A crew from Sky Tower LLC, out of Oklahoma City, OK, made the almost 1000' climb earlier in late March to repair a damaged transmission line. With the line work repaired, it took another eight weeks before the transmitter manufacturer was available to complete the installation and certify it for broadcast, meeting the requirements of the FCC.

Initially, a violent storm damaged the Lakeshore PBS TV transmitter on July 16, 2018 knocking the station off the air. After testing and repeated attempts to repair the existing system following the storm, it was determined that the 15-year-old transmitter was damaged beyond repair. Lakeshore PBS then moved forward with purchasing a new transmitter.

It was at this time that multiple faults were discovered in the transmission lines, preventing the temporary transmitter from operating properly. After further investigation, damage was found which was believed to have been caused by vandalism that occurred on the overnight of August 3.

Vice President of TV Operations for Lakeshore PBS Matt Franklin described the challenge as a worst case scenario that was more than a simple supply and demand issue.

The station worked through the fall to find an available tower crew that was licensed to work on a broadcast tower of that height. Eventually, a crew scheduled to work in Milwaukee had a lastminute opening on October 1, leading to the first repair. The public television station continued to work to bring its full power broadcast transmitter up, but when cold weather hit the region in November, a new issue developed when the damaged line near the top allowed water in the line, which eventually froze. The ice in the system caused the signal to be reflected back, keeping the system from broadcasting.

Over the winter, the operations team went back to the phones to try and find a certified tower crew able to climb the 1000' structure located in Cedar Lake. Almost every company turned down the repair work due to the bitter cold of the season or with being overscheduled with repack work

Over the last six months, Lakeshore PBS has committed almost \$400,000 in equipment and repairs, removing the old transmitter and accompanying equipment and purchasing a new solid-state transmitter. The new system should eliminate single points of failure, operate on much less power and will be ATSC 3.0 ready, so it will be equipped for the next generation of broadcasting.

Lakeshore PBS signed on the air November 1987 as WYIN Channel 56, a commercially licensed public television station. The non-profit organization continued to upgrade the quality of station production and broadcast equipment over the years, with revenue generated through member contributions and support from local businesses and organizations, as well as state and federal grants.

Over 30 years later, the station remains the sole televised source for local information centered on Northwest Indiana.


