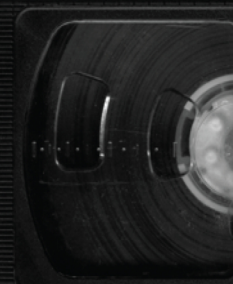

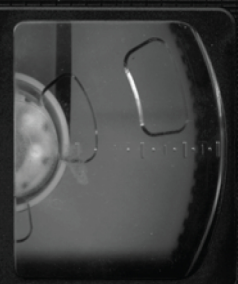

BNI Hosts STEM Camp for Children

Bishop Noll Institute will host STEM Summer Camp for Kids for children in kindergarten through eighth grade. The sessions are from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday. Weeks are July 8-12, July 15-19 and July 22-26. Children may attend one, two or three weeks. Cost is \$125 per camper per week. Discounts are available for families with more than one child.

Week 1 will focus on biological life and a variety of wildlife habitats, ecosystems and how humans impact them. Week 2 focuses on engineering and students will have the opportunity to build their own simple machines as they investigate basic aspects of building and design. Week 3 focuses on computer programming and coding.

Students will have the opportunity to work with Lego Mindstorms hardware as they learn to code and program using a variety of materials and activities throughout the week.

Thanks to a generous grant from the Foundations of East Chicago, any East Chicago resident may attend any Bishop Noll summer enrichment programs at no charge (proof of residency is required. There are 40 spots open for STEM Camp.)

Snacks will be provided. Children should bring their own sack lunch.

Water Safety Tips for Children

According to the CDC, drowning is the number-one cause of accidental death in children under the age of four. "Whether it's in a tub or a pool, water of any depth can be dangerous for kids," says Alex Zielinski, a firefighter with Hammond Professional Firefighters Union Local 556.

Hammond firefighters advise that by taking proper precautions, accidental drowning can be prevented.

Your Hammond firefighters have joined Nationwide's "Make Safe Happen" (www.makesafehappen.com) campaign to create greater awareness of water safety and protect children from accidental drowning. This Water Safety campaign (<http://makesafehappen.com/safety-tips/water-safety-children>) offers safety tips and other resources, including bathtub safety, how to identify "dry drowning" and how to keep your swim area safe.

"It's also important to know how these water deaths in children are happening," says Zielinski. "This is critical

information that all caretakers of young children should know."

Important safety tips include: 1) Always be in arm's distance from your child; 2) Choose life jackets over water wings; 3) Stay clear of drains; 4) Install a fence around your home pool; 5) Learn CPR and first aid; 6) Always have a phone with you to call for help.

"Kids love to make a splash, but they often don't know their limits," says Zielinski. "That's why we need to actively watch them when they're in and around water."

PBS Hosts Region's Quiz Show

For the 9th year, Lakeshore PBS is showcasing some of the best and brightest young minds in the region with their high school quiz show, "Making the Grade".

Schools participating this year include Andrean, Bowman Academy, Chesterton, Crown Point, Lowell, Merrillville, Portage, River Forest, South Central, Westville, Wheeler and Valparaiso. Gavit & Kankakee Valley were forced to drop out at the last minute due to scheduling conflicts.

"I'm always excited to see the schools show up each year," said Andy Schultz, who returns as host for his fifth season. "We take their recognizable quiz bowl format, add lights, cameras, and buzzers, and have a chance see some very bright and talented students do their best work for a television audience. It's something all participating students can be proud of," said Schultz.

James A. Muhammad, President and CEO of Lakeshore Public Media, sees the production as an example of what the region has to offer. "I continue to be impressed, season

after season, with how well-prepared the students are for this competition," Muhammad said.

The show will premiere on Lakeshore PBS on June 10 at 5:30pm. Lakeshore PBS Passport members can see all shows from season 9 online now.

Matt Franklin, the show's executive producer, hopes the program connects with viewers of all ages with different backgrounds and different levels of knowledge. "We have a long history of producing programs that spotlights athletic feats from around the region," Franklin said.

"The students are engaged from the moment they walk in the door of the studio until the end of the tournament in intelligent discussion with peers, interaction with a working television crew, and the usual clowning around to reduce some of the pressure of the tournament format," Schultz said. "It's a highlight for me each spring."

Providing Extra Security to School Dances

My School Dance, located in Merrillville, IN, is determined to increase the safety measures on school functions, such as dances, with their features. Not only does the platform make dance managing easier for the teachers in charge, but it adds an extra level of safety for the event.

My School Dance was established over a year ago in Merrillville, Indiana by their parent company, Think Tank NTG. The mission behind My School Dance is to make the lives of everyone involved in a school dance easier than before. For many years, schools have been planning dances the old-fashion way: cash boxes during lunch, handing out and collecting all permission slips, and flipping through packets of names to check each student in.

With everything going on in the world today, schools need to be more cautious and safe when it comes to hosting events for their students. The money from the cash box could get stolen, students can forge their parent's signatures, and basically anyone can sneak into a dance without being seen. It's time for schools to change their dance managing method to not only help them, but encourage more safety within our schools.

Taylor Buckley, Chief Operations Officer, said, "My School Dance is committed to helping schools have safer events."

All ticket sales are done online through the most secure payment processor and the money goes straight into the school's account. Digital agreements require

the parent/guest parent/guest administrator to create their own account to sign all permission slips on behalf of the student.

Schools now actually have the ability to use a QR code scanner to check students in and out of the dance. They can integrate text notifications sent to the student's parents letting them know when their child arrives and leaves the dance.

Buckley said, "For one of our schools, that meant that parents knew their child arrived safely to the Prom that was 30 miles away while it was pouring rain. For another school, it meant the teacher could call the parent of a student who hadn't shown up to the dance to let them know."

Being able to access emergency contact information quickly is extremely beneficial for the schools.

"It allows school teachers and administrators to ensure that parents can be notified quickly if anything were to happen at a school event," said Buckley.

Since launching My School Dance last year, there are over 11,000 users, almost 10,000 tickets sold, and 15,000 agreements that have been signed by parents, guest parents, and guest administrators. More features are being created to enhance our measures of safety for our students and make the dance managing process easier for our teachers.

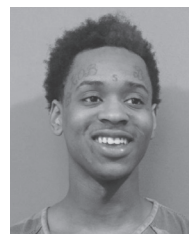

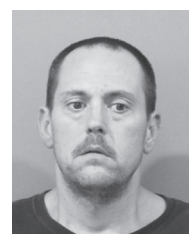

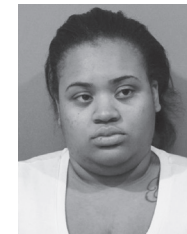
