Meritorious Service

The Meritorious Service Award is presented when a particularly notable accomplishment in the line of duty showing outstanding initiative and achievement under adverse conditions with some degree of hazard to the officer. Three awards were presented at the Mayor's Night Out on August 7, 2019 to Officers Cody Baker, Sean Matheny and Joseph Drzich.

Officer Baker, on July 10th, responded to a business robbery in progress. As he approached, he observed the suspect running from the business. With no information about a possible weapon being held by the suspect, Baker chased the suspect on foot and captured him. The stolen items from the robbery were recovered and the suspect was arrested.

On July 2nd, Officer Matheny saw suspicious males at 2:00 am in an alley behind the gas station in the 6900 block of Indianapolis Blvd. Matheny attempted to speak to the subjects, Officer Drzich heard the call and responded. When he arrived, he saw Matheny struggling with the subjects. Both Matheny and Drzich were struggling with the subjects when Officer Drzich noticed that one of the males had a gun. The officers were able to secure the three subjects without harm. We believe Matheny and Drzich prevented the gas station from being robbed that evening and a gun removed from our streets.

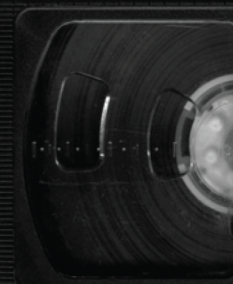

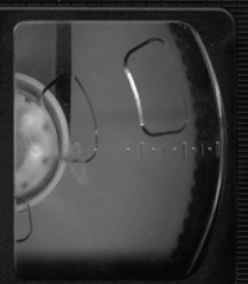

New Sculptures Come to Gabis Arboretum

VALPARAISO, Ind. — Three new outdoor sculptures have been placed on the beautiful grounds of Gabis Arboretum at Purdue Northwest. Gabis Arboretum's Executive Director, Stephanie Blackstock, said that the sculptures allow guests to engage with their natural surroundings in a new way.

"Outdoor sculptures have been known to bring people feelings of peace and inner joy. They allow viewers the opportunity to experience nature at a much deeper level. We are thrilled that Purdue Northwest has made it possible for these sculptures to be featured."

"In the short time that the sculptures have been at the arboretum, the response has been very positive," said Judy Jacobi, assistant vice chancellor of University Art Collections and Special Programs at Purdue Northwest. "Their beauty compliments Gabis's stunning natural environment, and also promotes great conversation among visitors."

The three sculptures feature the work of noted area artists. One is a gift to Purdue University Northwest. The two others are on-loan to the university by the artists and will be displayed at the arboretum for two years.

"Homage" is dedicated to the world renowned cellist Yo-Yo Ma. It is a swirling group of cellos, but also a five foot in diameter yo-yo. Sculptor Rich Kiebdaj captures both the exuberant persona of the

gifted musician, and the joy of the colorfully featured spinning yo-yo. Blackstock said this piece was selected for its musical connection and was installed near the arboretum's outdoor concert venue.

"Woman with a Hat" is a classically modernist sculpture of bronze and stone. Both are natural materials favored by sculptor Terry Karpowicz. His bold placement of the stone elicits surprise with a touch of humor. The work pays tribute to Pablo Picasso, who juxtaposed materials with witty spontaneity. The work was installed in the Hitz Family Rose Garden to encourage creativity that matches the garden's Scrabble board design.

"Don't worry, the world's not flat!" is a quirky piece by young artist, Jason Hawke. It features colorful characters scrambling up a circular form. It's ironic in that the black form does not appear to be flat, but spurs individual curiosity and reflection. A recent observer commented on the piece saying it made him cast his worries aside each day he passed it. Blackstock said placing the work against a beautiful wooded backdrop enables visitors to revel in the work's calming effect.

Purdue Northwest professor among winning team of scientists studying the origin of the universe

HAMMOND AND WESTVILLE, Ind. — Finding the origin of the universe through the tiniest of particles has been the life quest of Purdue University Northwest (PNW) Professor of Physics Neeti Parashar. She was recently honored among more than 400 scientific researchers with the 2019 High Energy and Particle Physics Prize awarded by the European Physical Society (EPS).

EPS recognized the work of two research collaborations, CDF and D0 (D-ZERO), “for the discovery of the top quark and the detailed measurement of its properties” on July 15, 2019 in Ghent, Belgium. Parashar is a research scientist on the D0 collaboration.

Teaching in the Chemistry and Physics Department at PNW’s College of Engineering and Sciences, Parashar was instrumental in securing full and contributing membership of the D0 collaboration in 2006. The team is based at the Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory located in Batavia, Illinois, which houses the particle collider accelerator used in the research.

“To discover and subsequently make detailed studies of these fundamental particles, you need the right operating conditions of the accelerator,” said Parashar. “While the top quark was discovered in 1995, the challenge has been to study all of its properties, like mass, width, electroweak couplings, production cross sections, and decay branching ratios.”

Understanding these properties accurately will help researchers explore unique information on fundamental interactions at the electroweak breaking scale and beyond.

Subatomic research at PNW isn’t limited to only faculty. Parashar regularly takes her team of undergraduate students to Fermilab and to Geneva, Switzerland to conduct experiments at the European Organization for Nuclear Research, known as CERN.

“We at PNW are on the global map of scientific discoveries,” said Parashar. “Purdue Northwest is the only institution in Northwest Indiana with full membership to these world-renowned research labs, and the recipient of peer reviewed, merit-based federal funding from the National Science Foundation to conduct this research.”

Seven years ago, Parashar, who founded and heads PNW’s high-energy physics program at PNW, was also among those on the research team that discovered the Higgs boson, dubbed “The God Particle.” The 2013 Nobel Prize in physics was awarded to Peter Higgs, of the University of Edinburgh, and Francois Englert, of the Universite Libre de Bruxelles, for predicting the existence of the Higgs boson.

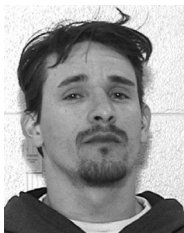

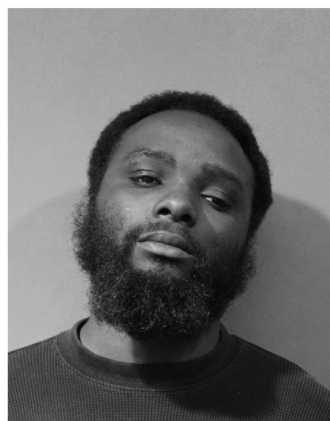

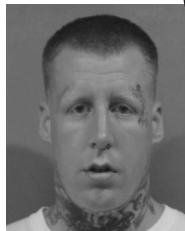
