



Purdue Recognized in Best College Rankings

Purdue University Northwest (PNW) once again has been recognized among the best regional universities in the U.S. News & World Report Best Colleges rankings, released today.

PNW ranks 52nd nationally among the Best Engineering Programs, of engineering schools whose highest degree is a bachelor's or master's degree. PNW's undergraduate business program has also been rated as one of the top programs among those accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB).

"Purdue Northwest is committed to academic excellence, and the recognition of these high-performing academic programs further validates the quality of our faculty members, facilities and the education our students receive," PNW Chancellor Thomas L. Keon said. "PNW is proud to be recognized among such significant higher education peers."

U.S. News ranks undergraduate engineering programs accredited by ABET, a non-profit, non-governmental organization that accredits college and university programs. The rankings are based on surveys of engineering deans and senior faculty at accredited programs. PNW, ranked No. 52 in the country, received a 2.9 peer assessment score on a 5-point scale, sharing the position with 15 other

High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also have to meet certain height and weight requirements.

Blood and platelet donors can save time at their next donation by using RapidPass® to complete their pre-donation reading and health history questionnaire online, on the day of their donation, before arriving at the blood drive. To get started, follow the instructions at RedCrossBlood. org/RapidPass or use the Blood Donor App.



First Bicycle Repair Station in Hammond

Due to a gift from the United Citizens Association, Inc. (UCA), users of Hammond's growing system of bicycle trails can now inflate tires, make adjustments and even repairs. The DERO Fix it Station is located along the Wolf Lake Trail near the guardhouse.

DERO Fix it Stations includes all the tools necessary to perform basic bike repairs and maintenance, from changing a flat to adjusting brakes and derailleurs. Housed in a modified well casing, tools are securely attached to the stand with stainless steel cables and tamper-proof fasteners. The Fix it station also allows users to hang the bike from hanger arms which allows the pedals and wheels to spin freely while making adjustments. The station also features a heavy-duty air pump with a 1-inch solid pump shaft. The unit's bright red paint makes it stand out and quite visible.

"The UCA has a long history of providing and promoting improvements to the community, in particular Robertsdale" noted Mayor Thomas M. McDermott, Jr. "Its members actually established Hammond's first bike path in 1974 along Sheffield Avenue,

were advocates of the George Lake Trail, and many other community improvements such as the hanging baskets along 119th Street in Robertsdale, and I appreciate their continued commitment to making our city a better place to live and visit. As an avid bicycling enthusiast, I was impressed by how heavy-duty and durable the fix-it station is."

Tom Dabertin, UCA Vice President stated: "The UCA supports Mayor McDermott's efforts to make Hammond a destination for bicyclists. Hammond offers one of the biggest and best trail systems in the State of Indiana, and it is our hope that this is the first of several fix-it stations in Hammond and that the trend continues to neighboring communities in the future." The UCA organizes the annual Ride and Rail Tour to Chicago in cooperation with the Northern Indiana Commuter Transportation District (NICTD) instrumental was in establishment of the WHAM Ride.
