

PNW shares Women's History Month events

Purdue University Northwest (PNW) will recognize Women's History Month throughout March with a slate of events that highlights chapters in women's history, facilitates inspiring guest speakers, addresses women's issues and celebrates women leaders.

Lifting up women leaders

Several PNW Women's History Month events will include forums for inspiring women speakers and leaders to candidly share details about their professional journeys as women, as well as impart their advice for professional peers and students.

The marquee panel, Unleashing Empowerment, will come together on March 28 starting at 4 p.m. This inaugural leadership panel and networking event will welcome back three impactful alumnae to Alumni Hall on PNW's Hammond campus to recount their career challenges and successes. The three panelists include Constance Adams (AS '85, BS '93, MS '09, DNP '20), Linda Nethery (BS '84) and Sandra Patino (MA '19).

The subtitle for the event is "Stepping Outside of the Box," an allusion to storyline elements from the 2023 critically acclaimed Barbie film encouraging women to confidently pursue career choices that are fulfilling to them, as well as increase women's representation and leadership in the professional world.

"We look forward to welcoming back our esteemed alumnae to energize our campus community with their inspirational personal stories," said Katie Holderby, director of Alumni Engagement at PNW. "We want to share infectious confidence-building messages to event attendees so that they may be motivated to take the next steps in their professional journeys. On March 21 the Leadership Institute and Society of Innovators at Purdue Northwest will host the second annual Women on the Rise reception starting at 4:30 p.m. at PNW's Westville campus. An annual PNW Women's History Month campus tradition is the Women's Leadership Luncheon, taking place on March 19. The action is set in Truvy's beauty salon in Chinquapin, Louisiana, where all the ladies who are "anybody" come to have their hair done. Helped



THIS DAY IN HISTORY March 15, 1968

Construction begins on America's highest vehicle tunnel

On March 15, 1968, construction starts on the north tunnel of the Eisenhower/ Johnson Memorial Tunnel on Interstate 70 in Colorado, some 60 miles west of Denver. Located at an elevation of more than 11,000 feet, the project was an engineering marvel and became the world's highest vehicular tunnel when it was completed in 1979. Four months after opening, one million vehicles had passed through the tunnel; today, some 10 million vehicles drive through it each year.

The north tunnel (or bore) was finished on March 8, 1973 and named for America's 34th president, who was in office from 1953 to 1961. Construction on the south tunnel began on August 18, 1975, and was finished on December 21, 1979. The south tunnel was named for Edwin C. Johnson, a Colorado governor and U.S. senator who was a big supporter of an interstate highway system across his state. (Interstate 70 stretches more than 2,100 miles from Interstate 15 near Cove Fort, Utah, to Baltimore, Maryland. It was America's first interstate highway project. Construction began in 1956 and ended in 1992 in Glenwood Canyon, located near the city of Glenwood Springs in western Colorado.)

The north tunnel cost \$117 million to construct and at the height of the building process, some 1,140 people worked three shifts, 24

hours a day, six days a week. The south tunnel cost \$145 million and employed 800 workers, approximately 500 of whom were involved in drilling operations.

The Eisenhower/Johnson Tunnel cuts through the Continental Divide at an average elevation of 11,112 feet. (Driving conditions around the tunnel can be challenging during the months between November and April: The surrounding area receives an average of 26 feet of snow during those months.) The north tunnel, which handles westbound traffic, is 1.693 miles long, while the south tunnel (eastbound traffic) is 1.697 miles. Illuminating those tunnels is no small task-each has approximately 2,000 light fixtures using 8-foot bulbs.

The Eisenhower/Johnson Tunnel is an impressive accomplishment, but it's small potatoes compared to some others. The 15.2 mile-long Laerdal Tunnel in Norway is the world's longest road tunnel. One of the busiest vehicular tunnels in America is the Lincoln Tunnel, which was built under the Hudson River to connect New Jersey and Midtown Manhattan in New York City. That tunnel's center tube opened in 1937, while its north tube opened in 1945 and its south tube in 1957. In 2019, roughly 18 million vehicles passed through the Lincoln Tunnel.

Dozens Attend Internationally Accredited Contractor Education Program



Nearly two dozen tradespeople from a variety of disciplines came together to collaborate and level up their skills during the Northwest Indiana Mason Contractors Association's (NWIMCA) recent continuing education program.

The event was free for the regional contractor community, and brought together architectural, engineering, construction, and masonry professionals from multiple companies. Many of the lessons were designed to teach professionals about the ins-and-outs of other trades. For example, information about masonry materials was presented to architects so they could learn how to best utilize these construction materials in their building designs.

Attendees were able to earn continuing education credits (CEUs) that met criteria under the Architects International Association's (AIA/CES) guidelines, which is an internationally accredited body that is considered to have some of the best learning standards in the industry.

"Our association is proud to host this event every year because it truly fosters a stronger sense of understanding throughout the building trades. You encounter lots of different types of contractors on construction projects, and when everyone can come together in a comprehensive way, things sure go a lot smoother. These relationships are key for successful project outcomes," said Jeff Colvin, president of NWIMCA.

"There's also the added benefit of high-quality education and career advancement opportunities for our attendees through the earning of CEUs," Colvin said.

Other lessons that took place during the event included hands-on instruction about masonry basics, best practices about flashing and moisture control, information about the movement characteristics of structural masonry wall systems, and much more.

The association's next major event will be the popular NWIMCA Golf Outing at White Hawk Country Club in Crown Point on August 22nd. Those wishing to attend are advised to register early, as the event is limited and may sell out well before August. Classic film Hoosiers Locations

The 1986 classic film Hoosiers was shot in various locations throughout Indiana, providing a vivid and immersive backdrop for the story. New Richmond, Knighstown, St. Philip Neri Catholic School in Indianapolis, Brownsburg, Memorial Gymnasium in Lebanon, and Hinkle Fieldhouse at Butler University provided backdrops for the film.

Fans of the movie can enjoy a trip to these iconic locations and explore the same areas that helped bring the film to life. New Richmond is a small town of 333 located in Montgomery County. The downtown area provided settings for many of the town scenes throughout Hoosiers. Knighstown is home to the Hoosier Gym, the set for the home gym.

St. Philip Neri Catholic School in Indianapolis provided a setting for the away game against Cedar Knob Knights. At the same time, Brownsburg and Memorial Gymnasium in Lebanon were sites for sectional and regional on-screen games. Finally, Hinkle Fieldhouse at Butler University served as the location of the state championship game featured at the climax of Hoosiers.

Visiting these locations would be worthwhile for any fan of Hoosiers or classic sports films. Travelers can visit the Hoosier filming locations and take in some stunning views, such as those seen during nearby outdoor scenes across rolling hillsides and farmlands, an essential element to anchoring this classic movie into its real-life setting.

Norman Dale (Gene Hackman) makes his presence known in the rustic town of Hickory, stepping into the local high school. His gaze falls upon a collection of basketball trophies, accolades of yesteryears, perched on a hallway shelf.

7544 S Nineveh Rd in Nineveh is where the team filmed the exterior and interior shots of Hickory High School. Initially built in 1906 with additions added in 1936 (gymnasium), 1950, and 1961, this building eventually saw its last high school class graduate in 1967 and partially burned down in 1994 before being demolished in 2000.

Today, fans can visit this location as it is home to a United States Postal Service building. However, its exterior features remain unchanged from when it appeared in Hoosiers.


Travel via private vehicle from Indianapolis using Interstate 65 South to reach this destination. The location is open to the public, granting you access to explore both the inside and outside of the premises.

During the evening, Norman (Gene Hackman) finds himself in the company of several

townsfolk at the local barbershop, peppered with inquiries. He reveals that his last coaching stint was 12 years ago in Ithaca, New York, and he has served in the Navy for the past decade.

The men freely share their thoughts on how Norman should manage the team, unanimously agreeing that Jimmy's (Maris Valainis) return to the Huskers is crucial for a victorious season. Growing weary of the relentless questioning and unsolicited advice, Norman abruptly concludes the informal gathering and departs.

106 E. Washington St. in Indianapolis, Indiana, is where the scene unfolded. Although it has had significant alterations, it remains a reminder of the



beloved movie. Nowadays, this location hosts several companies, such as a clothing store and an employment agency.

The location does not mirror what the movie portrayed. Nevertheless, visitors can immerse themselves in the nearby vicinity, as the city retains the ambiance reminiscent of the film.

To reach this location, travel by car or public transportation. If you plan on driving there, use Google Maps for directions or check out Waze for traffic updates. If you opt for public transit, you have a few options, such as taking buses 35 from Eagledale or 13 from the Near Southeast area to Washington and East Streets.



Abnormal and "Innocent" Heart Murmurs

What causes heart murmurs? Abnormal heart murmurs in adults are usually related to defective heart valves. Abnormal heart murmurs in adults may be related to:

- Valve calcification
- Endocarditis
- Rheumatic fever

Some heart murmurs, called innocent murmurs, may occur in children. They are not considered to be serious and may be caused by:

- Congenital heart disease including valve abnormalities
- Holes in the septum of the heart

Heart murmurs related to valve problems should receive follow-up care.

Not every murmur is associated with valve disease. Murmurs can also be caused by conditions that may temporarily increase blood flow such as:

- Exercise
- Pregnancy
- Fever
- Hyperthyroidism
- Anemia
- Rapid growth spurts in children

If a murmur is detected, follow-up tests may be recommended. Although some heart murmurs indicate heart valve problems, others are considered harmless. These are "innocent" murmurs.

What are innocent heart murmurs?

Innocent heart murmurs are harmless sounds made by the blood circulating normally through the heart's chambers and valves or through blood vessels near the heart. They can be common during infancy and childhood and often disappear by adulthood. They're sometimes known as "functional" or "physiologic" murmurs.

Some harmless murmurs require additional tests such as an electrocardiogram (ECG) or echocardiogram (echo) to rule out the possibility of a problem.

Innocent murmurs are common in healthy infants, children and adolescents. Innocent murmurs also may disappear and then reappear.

Innocent heart murmurs are so common that most children

are likely to have one at some time. Innocent murmurs may disappear and then reappear. When a child's heart rate changes, such as during excitement or fear, these innocent murmurs may

become louder or softer. This still doesn't signal that the murmur is cause for concern.

If your doctor hears a murmur when listening to your child's heart, they may recommend additional testing, such as an electrocardiogram (ECG) or echocardiogram (echo). This is to confirm the murmur is innocent. Unless testing suggests otherwise, no additional steps are needed.

With an innocent heart murmur, your child won't need medication, and doesn't have a heart problem or heart disease. You will not need to restrict your child's activities or diet. They can lead an active, healthy life!

Innocent murmurs don't require medication, don't create cardiac symptoms and don't mean there is a heart problem or disease.

Most innocent murmurs disappear when a child reaches adulthood, but some adults still have them. When a child's heart rate changes, such as during exercise, excitement or fear, the innocent murmur may become louder or softer.

Diagnosing the Cause: Types of Heart Murmurs

Your health care provider will investigate the root cause of the heart murmur. Clues about

the cause can be based on the loudness, location and quality of the murmur. Loudness is graded from 1 to 6. A grade of 1 is very faint, heard only with a special effort. A grade 6 is extremely loud and can be heard with a stethoscope even without touching the chest.

Mitral Valve

The location, duration and loudness of the murmur can help your health care provider determine which heart valve is involved as well as the severity.

Other tests may be done to decide if the murmur needs further investigation including:

- Chest X-ray
- Electrocardiogram (ECG)
- Echocardiogram
- Cardiac catheterization

As with most conditions, heart murmurs and any underlying problems can vary in severity and risk.

Any time a murmur is suspected to be associated with a valve problem that may need treatment or repair, it's wise to look for a qualified health care professional with experience diagnosing and treating your condition. A specialist who regularly manages valve disease can assess your condition and offer treatment options.
