THIS DAY IN HISTORY June 1, 1926

Marilyn Monroe Born

Norma Jeane Mortenson—who will become better known around the world as the glamorous actress and sex symbol Marilyn Monroe—is born on June 1, 1926, in Los Angeles, California. She was later given her mother's name, and baptized Norma Jeane Baker.

After a tumultuous childhood—both maternal grandparents and her mother were committed to mental institutions, and she lived with a string of foster families—Norma Jeane married one of her neighbors, James Dougherty, when she was 16. He later joined the Merchant Marines and was sent to the South Pacific during World War II. A photographer “discovered” the naturally photogenic Norma Jeane while she was working in a California munitions factory, and she was soon launched into a successful modeling career. She divorced Dougherty in June 1946 and soon after signed a film contract with 20th Century Fox.

At the outset of her acting career, Norma Jeane dyed her brown hair blonde and changed her name again, calling herself Marilyn Monroe (Monroe was her grandmother's last name). After a bit part in 1947's *The Shocking Miss Pilgrim*, she had a string of forgettable roles before landing a spot in John Huston's thriller *The Asphalt Jungle* (1950). That same year, she also drew attention for her work in *All About Eve*, starring Bette Davis. Her true breakout performance, however, came in *Niagara* (1953), a thriller in which Monroe played an adulterous young wife who plots with her lover to kill her husband.

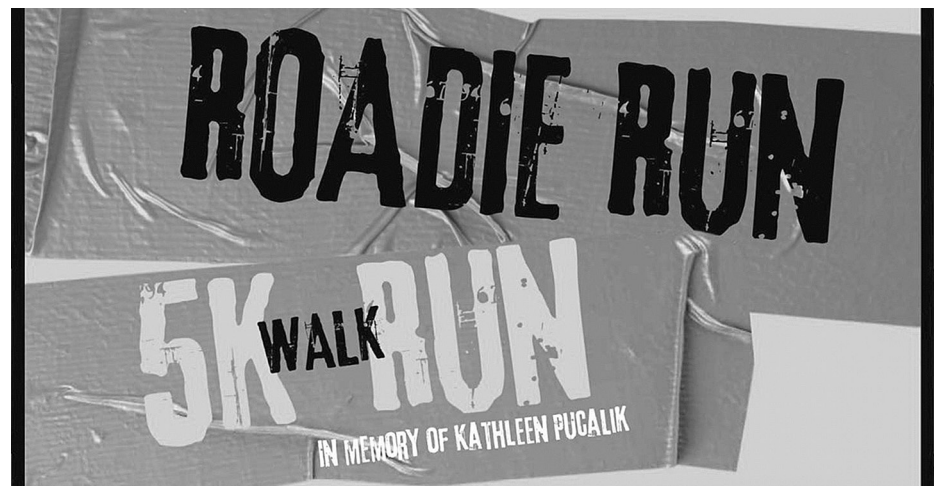
After starring turns in *Gentleman Prefer Blondes* and *How to Marry a Millionaire*—both also released in 1953—Monroe was at the top of Hollywood's A-list. In January 1954, she married baseball great Joe DiMaggio at

San Francisco's City Hall after a two-year romance. Though the press hailed their relationship as the quintessential All-American love affair, trouble began brewing almost immediately. DiMaggio was notoriously uncomfortable with his new wife's sexy public image, and her wild popularity, as evidenced by the near-riot among U.S. servicemen stationed in Korea during a performance she gave in the middle of the couple's honeymoon. They would divorce that October, after only nine months of marriage, but remained good friends. (After Monroe's death, DiMaggio famously sent roses to her grave several times a week for more than three decades, until his own death in 1999.)

Monroe attempted to switch to more serious acting roles, studying at the prestigious Actors' Studio in New York. She earned positive reviews for her more nuanced work in *Bus Stop* (1956), *The Prince and the Showgirl* (1957) and particularly *Some Like It Hot* (1959). By 1961, however, trouble in Monroe's personal life—her third marriage, to the acclaimed playwright Arthur Miller, dissolved after four years—had led to her increasing emotional fragility, and that year she was admitted on two occasions to hospitals for psychiatric observation and rest. Her final film was *The Misfits* (1961), written by Miller and co-starring Montgomery Clift and Clark Gable (it would also be Gable's final appearance on-screen). In June 1962, Fox dismissed the actress after repeated and extended absences from the set of *Something's Got to Give*. On August 5, 1962, Monroe was found dead from an overdose of barbiturates in her home in Brentwood, California. She was 36 years old.

Purdue University Northwest announces Richard Sévère as next dean of the College of Humanities, Education and Social Sciences

Purdue University Northwest (PNW) announced following a national search that Richard Sévère will join the university as dean of the College of Humanities, Education and Social Sciences (CHESS), effective July 1, 2025.

Sévère most recently served as associate dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Valparaiso University. As associate dean, his accomplishments included oversight and leadership of the College of Arts and Sciences' 17 departments, management of the college's budget and growth of research opportunities for faculty members in the college. Sévère held earlier leadership appointments as chair and faculty member in the department of English and acting chair of the department of Kinesiology. He also was the implementation leader for the university's Bloom Scholars Program.

Sévère previously served at Centenary University in Hackettstown, New Jersey,

where he held leadership positions as founding director of the Centenary Writing Collaboratory and founding director for the Centenary Scholars Program.

"We are delighted and excited for Richard Sévère to join our Academic Affairs team to lead the College of Humanities, Education and Social Sciences amidst the changing landscape of higher education, the expanding vibrancy of Northwest Indiana and rising optimism across the college and university," said Marie T. Mora, provost and vice chancellor for Academic Affairs at PNW. "With his experience as an academic and leader, I am confident he will amplify the college's established reputation, programmatic strengths, and dedication to improving the quality of life and place for our students (many of whom are first-generation college students, adult learners, and other non-traditional students), their families, and communities, as well as for our

faculty and staff, especially as we launch the implementation of our new strategic plan."

As dean of CHESS at PNW, Sévère will lead an academic college offering over 20 programs at the undergraduate, master's and applied doctoral levels. PNW's CHESS provides multiple innovative and experiential learning pathways in the liberal arts disciplines and is PNW's largest academic college by student population.

"I am honored and excited to join the PNW community," Sévère said. "The university's commitment to serving and uplifting students and our region resonates with my passions as an educator and leader. I look forward to working alongside faculty, staff and students in the College of Humanities, Education and Social Sciences to provide innovative programs and opportunities that prepare our graduates to be dynamic leaders in Northwest Indiana and beyond."



Richard Sévère has been named the next dean of Purdue University Northwest's College of Humanities, Education and Social Sciences.

Sévère earned his Ph.D. in Medieval Literature from Purdue University in West Lafayette. He earned his master's degree in English Literature Education and his bachelor's degree in English, both from Florida Agricultural & Mechanical (A&M) University.

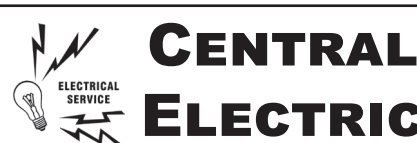

With planning and preparation, you can get back to daily life and resume your routine activities. You can help make physical activity part of every day. You can create a balanced eating plan for your loved one—one that everyone can live with and thrive on. Throughout it all, know that diabetes can't keep your loved one from doing whatever they want or achieving their highest goals. There are Olympic athletes with diabetes, as well as professional football

players, politicians, actors, rock stars and CEOs. So, take a deep breath. You can do so much to make sure the people you love are thriving as they manage their diabetes.

Keep Them Safe at School

When you're a parent, you feel like you can keep your children safe as long as you're with them. For parents of children with diabetes, that feeling is even louder. That's why our Safe at School® campaign works to make sure that the diabetes management needs of students are met so your children are healthy and safe when they are at school and out of your sight.

By working as a team, families, health care providers, and school staff can make sure that your child is being taken care of. Through Safe at School, newly diagnosed children can depend on school staff to monitor their blood glucose (blood sugar) and administer insulin. - Plan ahead for birthday parties, holidays, or restaurant visits. You can communicate to party hosts about special needs ahead of time, or check restaurant menus before going.

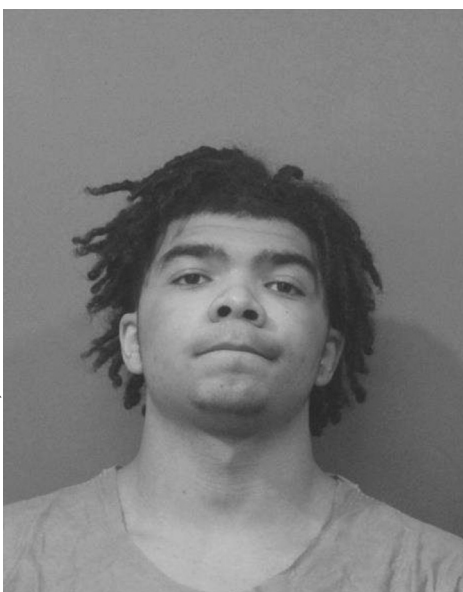

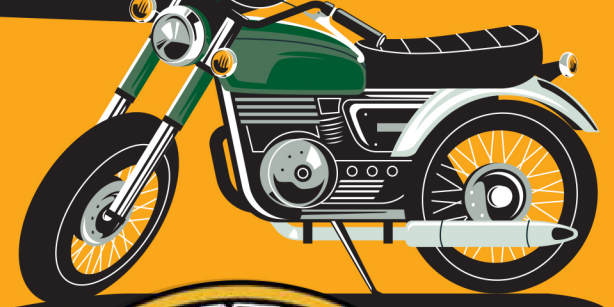
